### Choose the right size luggage

1 checked Bag less than 50 lbs/18 kgs

1 carry on bag

1 personal item (shoulder bag, backpack, laptop bag)





The maximum dimensions for a carry-on bag are 9 inches x 14 inches x 22 inches (22 cm x 35 cm x 56 cm), including handles and wheels.

### Quantity

limits: cannot exceed 2 kg (70 ounces) or 2 L (68 fluid

Liquids, gels, and aerosols in carryon baggage are further limited to ounces). Containe 100-ml (3.4 oz)






#### Wind Turbines - Can they Spin? How High? by Eryne Jenkins







One of the first questions the 17-member working group will need to answer is how to avoid the missteps that caused the undoing of Delaware's previous attempt to foster an offshore wind project under Carney's predecessor, former Gov. Jack Markell.


